




Memo from PTHA President ROBERT HUTT

We can't stress enough with the implementation of HISA rules how important it is to race to a Condition Book and not a "smorgasbord of Extra Races" on an Overnight; especially, when you can't race a horse for 14 days after you treat it (HISA). The new Condition Book will be tailored to the existing colony of horses on the backstretch.

Last, but not least, after many months of negotiations, we'll be announcing very soon the release of purse money to owners in good standing without having to wait for drug testing to be completed. We understand that you need your money on a timely schedule to meet your daily/weekly/monthly obligations. There are other many good things coming your way in 2024 as your PTHA Board works tirelessly to improve racing at PARX. Until next time, stay warm.



BRINGING PARX FANS TWO SHOWS!!

There is Always a Story to Tell about Racing Thoughts from Program Administrator Danielle Montgomery



PTHA's Turning for Home Inc. finished its fifteenth year with record support for retiring racehorses by our Parx Owners, who have donated over 4,044 horses for proper rehabilitation, retraining, and rehoming. You might notice a fourth effort we support: reloved. It's the message we shared on our first visit to the Pennsylvania Farm Show in coordination with the Pennsylvania Horse Racing Association (PHRA). Our focus was to let the public know more about horseracing and aftercare, by showing how our racehorses are loved first by their breeders and racing connections who support our mission to find them homes where they are "reloved.

RACEHORSE RETIREMENT PROGRAM

The Farm Show was a new experience, and it was surprising how many people had no idea of horseracing's positive impact in the Commonwealth, from supporting open spaces to providing good jobs and even to the agricultural impact of our manure supporting the largest cash crop in Pennsylvania: mushrooms! Samantha Potts and I, assisted (thankfully) by Nicole Pessanha and her father, Ney, handed out over 2,000 magnetic calendars from TFH, which influenced passers-by to ask questions about racehorse retirement and racing or visit our website later. We met quite a few OTTB enthusiasts, and with the help of the PHRA's Virtual Racing, we interacted with many new faces. Tony Black put us on the phone live from Farm Show with At the Races with Steve Byk, and you can listen to the archives at www.stevebyk.com for the January 11th broadcast.

TFH was also well-represented at the First Frontier Finals Rodeo, which took place over the weekend, with the only Thoroughbred finishing in the top twelve (5th) in Barrel Racing, Sweetly Talented, ridden by Ali Montgomery. The Another Spin program found many homes in Western disciplines for our prior horses, widening the outlets for many previously overlooked small, agile retired racehorses. The program could not run without the support of so many people: the PTHA, led by President Bob Hutt and Executive Director Jeff Matty, which sponsors TFH, and the Owners who donate with every start, the Parx Jockeys, who, led by Tony Black back in 2008, became the first jockey colony to support aftercare with a take-out for each win and place finish, Parx Management who support our Turning for Home Day this coming Labor Day, and every day, the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association (PHBA) who supports us and raises extra funding with auctions, raffles, and support for our upcoming events, and the racing public whose much appreciated donations (80% of expenses) go right to our horse care via stipends to supporting Partner Farms.

The biggest compliment we can give our Horsemen is that, along with our Veterinary community, TFH has witnessed improved soundness and future rideability of the horses coming into our program since its inception. All professional athletes experience injuries, and the medical staff is there to help them in any way to realize their dreams. Racehorses also have setbacks and injuries, and in this Mid-Atlantic region, racing supports quality equine clinics and top-notch surgeons who help us help them. Promising racehorses have owners who can afford cutting-edge therapies to help them come back to racing, and these medical breakthroughs trickle down to offer specializued equine medicine to all. But the fundamental safety of our horses lies with their Trainers and staff. Owners who work with their Trainers to make proactive decisions that put the welfare of horses and their riders above all else are the key. Over the years, professional advice has helped our program help as many horses as we needed to, and we are proud to say that, over all these years, we have never turned away an eligible horse for our rehoming program or been unable to perform life-saving surgeries when it was possible, thanks to our supporters.














Not all jobs on the backstretch are directly tied to horses or racing, but they are an important component of the industry. Those that labor and care for the horses have their own personal needs, which must be met. These needs might range from as simple as a quick cup of coffee to as substantial as a complete meal, which is where Angie Tonzelli of Ron's Backstretch Cafe plays a part. As a little girl growing up in Northeast Philadelphia, her parents would regularly take her to theracetrack. She recalls when they first broadcast the races on TV with Phonebet and how excited theywere. She wasn't familiar with or understood all the behind-the-scenes details, but she found them intriguing.

After losing her job at Coffee House in the Franklin Mills mall when the owner died in tragic circumstances, her uncle's girlfriend, who worked at Ron's Cafe, asked her if she wanted to work a couple of dark days. Angie began by simply operating the register, but after 20 years, she can be foundpreparing morning coffee, cooking, ordering supplies, cleaning, and even rushing to Monmouth Park to pick up deliveries that were mistakenly sent there. Angie expressed that her favorite aspect of her job is seeing the same people every day,

"IT'S ALMOST LIKE A FAMILY. I KNOW WHEN THEY WIN A RACE, HAVE A KID, EVEN WHEN THEY DON'T FEEL GOOD. THEY KNOW THE SAME ABOUT ME. IT'S SWEET."


FRANCES SIEGEL
