Best Bets: STRASSE (2nd) -- FLAT OUT FLYING (5th)

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- SUENO PROFUNDO Narrowly missed with similar at Monmouth after series of good local tries.
- FENWICK JACK Prone to poor starts but ran down nearly entire field in recent mild upset.
- EDDIEMUSH Just over two lengths behind top choice in Jersey and both victories here.
- **2** GAMERUN Not at his best lately but back in sprint and defeated top pick earlier in summer.

Race 2

- 2 STRASSE Used up after slow break this spot in first local try; won prior race at Churchill.
- 4 IFEELUCKY TONITE- Remote third with tougher version in route; likely prefers this distance.
- TRY HARDER Fired every time and sufficient ability but shelved since \$20,000 January claim.
- CRACK THE CODE Overmatched last pair after crushing lesser in June; just 1-for-26 log.

Race 3

- HIDDEN PROMISE Failed to offer true measure in slop after Martinez re-claimed; wins on best.
- HIBACHI Carried very wide into stretch when edged this spot; threat with clear sailing.
- WIZARD SERRAT Pursued runaway repeat winner this spot and prior loss on turf.
- LOOK OUT LAMBO Absent nearly three months since voided claim; 10 career victories.

Race 4

- 4 ANNA ROCKS Seen better days but firing lately and enough left to handle this kind.
- BEYOND A MILLION Drops back early and finding best stride too late; needs pace set-up.
- MORE RANSOM Humbled by runaway winner in sprint and makes rare two-turn attempt.
- LIKE A PRO Slow fuse and soundly beaten by top choice before; some progress necessary.

Race 5

- FLAT OUT FLYING Hampered by early trouble and amazing veteran with 18 wins and \$398,195.
- VINE JET Chased formidable winner in last and excellent record locally; key threat on best.
- ROADTRIPTONOWHERE Just missed this spot in second outing after hiatus; rare loss streak.
- SPLENDOR BEAUTY Prompted pace long way then tired against similar; rail zip poses threat.

Race 6

- 4 OLD HEAD Sharp effort last week despite poor start and traffic woes; back at price of claim.
- BUCKS SOME Failed as usual over wet surface but old mare often defeated tougher in past.
- WISHING ONA PRAYER Improved after Moore barn claimed; steps up within identical claim.
- 2 SO SWELL Very slow fuse but drops notch and runs big race on occasion; lively pace needed.

Race 7 SPY NOVEL – Edged over synthetic after solid try this spot following hiatus; draws rail and Paco DRUNKEN SAILOR - Major progress since switched to turf and first try against state-breds. CRISPER – Powerful stretch-runner overran solid field at Laurel; failed at 3-5 last local outing. MAX BARLEY – Narrowed gap despite extremely wide trip as longshot; ample early targets. Race 8 RINGER CARD – Sidelined year after showing much promise as juvenile; fast works and Lasix. ECLAIR BLANC – Back sprinting on dirt and frequently close but still maiden after 9 attempts. HONEST – Major improvement in Jersey at 92-1 after poor form in Texas; may continue progress PEACH TEA – Returns to main track over preferred surface and deserves some attention. Race 9 2 MAGIC MICHAEL – Victim of bad start at Laurel and excellent 9-for-13 over this track; soft field. 4 RIDEN WITH BIDEN – Classy in past but far from his best since return; much success with Paco. ITWASTHEDEVILSIDEA – Failed to give true measure at Monmouth after crushing lesser locally. MODERN ERA - Disliked turf and back home on main track; only score against maidens. Race 10 FAIR HAIRED BOY – Nearly overcame severe early trouble this spot; changes management.

BASSANIO – Ample ability and making key third start after layoff; top turf stable in Delacour. SMOKE WAGON – Rallied last to first in Penn National sprint; might hope for switch to dirt. HARBOR OF GOLD – Gives his best every time and just behind top choice only two-turn try.
