PTHA PRESIDENT'S CORNER

As the calendar turns toward Labor Day on August 24th, we celebrate the 20th anniversary of Smarty Jones just missing out on IMMORTALITY when he lost his last and only race of his career by one length while finishing a game second in the Belmont Stakes in pursuit of the 2004 Triple Crown. That fateful day, Smarty drew an all-time record Belmont Park crowd of 120,139, hoping to see the coronation of an undefeated Triple Crown champion.

Alas, it was not to be, as every jockey in the race made it a point to come at Smarty Jones in waves just to get him beat. Not many people know that in the middle of this grueling mile-and-a-half "test of champions," Smarty Jones actually ran a 22-second quarter mile, one of the fastest ever recorded in Belmont Stakes history. Beloved NYRA racetrack announcer Tom Durkin, a staunch Smarty Jones fan, believed in him so much that secretly, that morning, he marked off with red tape 31 lengths along the rail, believing Smarty Jones capable of eclipsing the record margin of victory previously held by the immortal, Secretariat. Softened up by that very fast middle quarter mile, Birdstone rallied late in the deep stretch to deny Smarty Jones his date with destiny and his Triple Crown.

Twenty long years ago a Pennsylvania Bred horse named lovingly Smarty Jones by his wonderful owner, Pat Chapman, arose from humble beginnings to capture the world's attention. Smarty was adored by racing fans all across our great country and is largely responsible for putting Philadelphia Park, now named PARX, on the map. Many believe he should have a statue erected in his honor, just like Sylvester Stallone's Rocky, as he epitomizes the blue-collar ethics of all Philadelphians. Yet for inexplicable reasons known only by a few HOF committee members, unbelievably, Smarty Jones is NOT in Racing's Hall of Fame! So, let's take a closer look at his statistics to see where he belongs in history.

The Belmont Stakes was Smarty Jones's last race. As his great trainer, John Servis, told me, Smarty laid it all on the line that day. He gave his all in that race and emptied his tank as he had nothing left to give. He was done! That's all you can ever ask of any champion. And make no mistake, Smarty Jones was and remains the "People's Champion," and no one can ever take that title away from him. He completed his career, winning eight of nine-lifetime races with the Belmont Stakes being his last race. His second-place finish that day by one length was the only blemish on what could have been an undefeated, illustrious career. Smarty won eight consecutive races and seven stakes and had career earnings of \$7,613,155. Smarty's Beyer speed figure of 107 in the Kentucky Derby is higher/faster than Triple Crown champions and Hall Of Fame inductees, American Pharoah's 105; and, Justify's 103.

PTHA PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Smarty won the Preakness Stakes by a RECORD 11 1/2 lengths and earned the all-time HIGHEST Preakness Beyer speed figure in history at 118, which still stands today two decades later. Many pundits believe that Smarty's Preakness victory might be the fastest race ever run in the 21st century? By Preakness comparison, American Pharoah recorded only a 102 Beyer and Justify just a 97. In Smarty Jones lone career Belmont Stakes defeat he still recorded a very respectable Beyer of 99 to American Pharoah's 105 and Justfy's 101.

Smarty Jones (2004) won eight of nine career starts, seven stakes with one-second place finish good for \$7,613,155 and was retired after the Belmont Stakes. Eleven years later Triple Crown champion American Pharoah (2015) won nine of eleven races, nine stakes including one second good for career earnings of \$8,650,300. Triple Crown champion Justify (2018) raced only six times in his career, winning all six races, but won only four stakes with career earnings of 3,798,000 and was also retired just like Smarty Jones after the Belmont stakes.

Smarty Jones earned faster Beyer figures than both Triple Crown champions in the Derby and Preakness. He won the Preakness stakes by a record margin and received the fastest recorded Beyer 118, both all-time records that still stand twenty years later. By comparison, the two Triple Crown champions only received Preakness Beyer's of 102 and 97, respectively.

Not to denigrate the undefeated Justify who deservingly belongs in the Hall Of Fame; however, Smarty Jones ran more races, nine to Justify's six; won more races, eight to Justify's six; won seven stakes to Justify's four; and earned double his career earnings fourteen years earlier when purses were less; Smarty also earned far superior Beyer numbers in pursuit of the Triple Crown when racetrack technology was not as advanced as today. Smarty Jones set records in winning the Preakness by a record margin while recording the fastest Preakness Beyer in history; and last but certainly not least, Smarty Jones drew 120,139 adoring fans to Belmont Park, a record that can never be broken proving his worldwide popularity. Reflect on that for a moment: Smarty Jones drew more fans to Belmont Park in 2004 than Triple Crown champions Secretariat in 1973, Seattle Slew in 1977, Affirmed in 1978, American Pharoah in 2015, and Justify in 2018. This overlooked statistic proves beyond a shadow of a doubt how beloved and popular Smarty Jones was. Yet here we are twenty years later, and Smarty Jones is still NOT in the Hall of Fame. How is this even possible?

On behalf of the PTHA and grateful racing fans from across our great nation, we dedicate this Saturday, August 24th, as Smarty Jones Day to celebrate the 20th anniversary of his spectacular achievements. Let our voices be heard in our hearts and around the world that Smarty Jones is and was one of the greatest horses to ever peer thru a bridal and deservingly should be enshrined in Racing's Hall of Fame! Thank you.

\$75,000 The Mayor's Mile was a duel to the wire with Adero & jockey Abner Adorno getting the win for trainer John Servis & owner Carguys Racing LLC with Concealed Carry & jockey Luis Ocasio getting a game second place finish for trainer Lou Linder, Jr., owners Branjam Stable & Dave Clark.





\$75,000 The State Representative's Sprint K.C. Tomlinson going 6 1/2 furlongs. Home town horse Speedy Bolt & jockey Eliseo Ruiz got third for trainer Lou Linder, Jr. & owner Over The Moon Racing Stable LLC.

Colonial Downs - Festival of Racing 8/11

Trainer Butch Reid, Jr. sent two from his talented stable on 8/11th in Virginia for their annual Festival of Racing at Colonial Downs.

3-year-old PA Bred filly Carmelina and jockey Mychel Sanchez shook clear, taking the field gate to wire going the 7 furlongs in the \$100,000 Penny Chenery Stakes for owners Cash Is King LLC & LC Racing LLC.

The competitive filly Neecie Marie took on Grade 2 company in the \$500,000 Beverly D. Stakes, going 1 mile & 3/16ths with international superstar jockey Lanfranco Dettori to a close 3rd place finish behind 2 top turf mares winner Moira & 2nd place finisher Fev Rover for owner Milam Racing Stables.

Monmouth Park - 8/25

The consistent mare Beach Daze rallied for third with her trusty pilot jockey Adam Bowman in the \$100,000 Eleven North Handicap for trainer Farrel Mann, owners All In Racing Stables LLC & J P S Stable going 6 furlongs in State Bred company



PENNSYLVANIA'S DAYat the RACES

The 23rd annual Pennsylvania's Day at the Races took place on a beautiful day at Parx Racing on Monday, August 26th. Hundreds of breeders attended the luncheon and enjoyed a variety of raffles, including a John Deere Zero-Turn Mower donated by NTRA, and a card featuring some of the best Pennsylvania-breds in training. FanDuel was on site for the eleven race card, and race-calling icon Larry Collmus provided picks and interviews throughout the day.

Stakes action kicked off in the seventh race with the \$100,000 Marshall Jenney Handicap over five furlongs. Moved from the turf to the main track, the field featured five entrants. With three horses vying for favoritism, lost in the shuffle was nine-year-old Smooth B, winner of the Marshall Jenney the last time the race came off the grass in 2022. Joined in a three-way duel for the early lead, Smooth B slipped past Traders Luck along the rail and drew off to a 3 ½ length victory at odds of 7-1. The son of Weigelia is out of St. Omer's Farm's brilliant broodmare Katarica Disco. Bred by St. Omer's and WynOaks Farm and owned by LC Racing, Smooth B boasts earnings of \$893,447 with 11 wins, 13 seconds, and 9 thirds in 61 starts.

PA-Sired, PA-Bred runners featured in the Jump Start Stakes over seven furlongs, and a strong field of six lined up. While Ninetyprcentmaddie took heavy money off his strong graded stakes showings in New York, Gordian Knot was a clear second choice in the wagering. With defending champion Veeson dueling through early fractions with 2023 PA Nursery winner Capo, Gordian Knot tracked in the clear before sweeping past the vying pair in the final furlong.... A homebred for Joe Imbesi, Gordian Knot now features 7 wins and 4 thirds in 14 starts for earnings of \$529,730.

The Storm Cat Stakes squared off a field of six over a mile and 70 yards. With a hot and contested early pace of 23.29 and 47.03 being laid down on the front end between favored Movisitor and Windsor Gold, 5-2 second choice Irish Cork was content to trail in last, six lengths off the lead. Margin of Air got the jump on the frontrunners and opened a two length lead at the top of the stretch, but Irish Cork and rider Frankie Pennington chugged along up the rail to collar the leader... The seven-year-old son of Flat Out was making his 41st career start and posted his first ever stakes victory in the Storm Cat for trainer John Servis and owners Irish Three Racing LLC. Bred by Two-Turn Farm LLC, Irish Cork was a \$15,000 weanling purchase at Keeneland November. His record now stands at 8 wins, 11 seconds, and 8 thirds in 41 starts and earnings of \$530,222.

While the Mrs. Penny Stakes was reduced to six when coming off the turf, it allowed the opportunity for Morning Matcha to run as a main track only entrant. With earnings standing at over \$970,000, a victory would anoint the five-year-old mare as racing's newest millionaire. A heavy 2-5 favorite in the mile and a sixteenth event, Morning Matcha tracked six lengths back in fifth before dropping to the rail and blowing past the leaders.

It was the fifth career stakes victory for Morning Matcha, whose record now boasts 8 victories, 7 seconds, and 7 thirds with earnings of \$1,029,940. Bred by Clovis and Joanna Crane's Crane Thoroughbred Services LLC, she was an \$18,000 yearling purchase for LC Racing at the 2020 Fasig Midlantic Fall Yearling Sale. Owned by LC, Cash is King, and Gary Barber and trained by Butch Reid, Morning Matcha is the 34th Pennsylvania-bred to earn over a million dollars on the racetrack....

A total of \$2,633,466 was handled on the card. A big thank you to Parx Racing and the PTHA for helping the PHBA conduct another successful PA Day at the Races!



Hunter and his younger sister Logan grew up watching races with their parents, Diane and Jockey Agent Robert Martel. At a young age, Hunter Martel knew he would end up working in the racing industry. He began walking horses for John Servis after earning his bachelor's degree in business from The College of New Jersey, before following in his father's footsteps as a Jockey Agent. He had several job interviews right out of college, but Hunter preferred the track's flexible schedule. This allowed him to pursue another interest of his, coaching wrestling at his alma mater, Hopewell Valley High School.

Hunter was surrounded by racing his entire childhood, but he never gave any thought to the many factors involved. He offered advice for those interested in entering the industry, "Come in and walk the horses, understand how the barns work, the lives of a hotwalker and groom, and how everything works. It's important to understand all the aspects of it. If you start at the bottom and work your way up that's your best bet whichever path you choose."

The experience of competing against his father's jockeys is something he describes as "exciting." He admits, "I'm always rooting for my jockey first but if Frankie (Pennington) wins or my dad's other jockeys win I'm always happy too. We're always rooting for the home team."


October will mark two years since he became a Jockey Agent, in that time he has learned a lot and believes his college background helps him with his connections and managing them in his work. Being able to have relationships with a variety of trainers opens up opportunities for his jockeys to ride horses such as Beach Daze for Farrell Mann and Kohler's for John Servis. He is especially grateful to the Hugo Padilla barn for giving him his first Stakes win as an agent with Bowman riding Lonesome Boy in the City Of Brotherly Love Stakes here at PARX.

Hunter spends a great deal of time at PARX with the jockeys he represents, Adam Bowman and Anthony Y. Nunez and loves it, "Coming in during training and hanging out with Adam, Anthony, my dad and Frankie is pretty cool. I get to hang out with some of my best friends every morning and work. So, it's not too bad."
