A mid-year check on TFH puts us on target to help over 300 horses again in 2024, with over 177 already assisted into retirement this year. With the funding TFH receives from the per-start takeout, we still have never turned away an eligible horse, and we can provide even more than just emergency support: we have helped three pneumonia horses this year, provided EPM medicines to a two, and the horse that wrenched his back falling in a race has successfully transitioned to turn out at our farm in NJ near MID-ATLANTIC EQUINE MEDICAL CENTER where he was treated. Trainer Gabrielle Hakim even went out to New Beginnings to see Johnny Ritt for himself, and we are proud to be able to provide the extended rehabilitation many programs can't afford. This is proof the PTHA and Parx Racing are still leading the way in Aftercare for every horse sent our way.

Following these horses on their second career path is an adventure where you may end up at a 5* event or a rodeo, cheering them on to a different kind of victory, and we want to provide that experience for horse racing fans and professionals alike. Thanks to the commitment of the Pennsylvania Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, President Bob Hutt, Executive Director Jeff Matty, the entire Board of Directors, the Owners, Trainers, Jockeys, Breeders, Parx Management, our Veterinarians, and everyone who chips in daily to make the moving parts flow, we can offer support horseshows that incentivize even more people to want to own Thoroughbreds.





People who give to others without expecting anything in return are genuinely exceptional. It goesbeyond simply being kind. What makes these people different is that they each have a special set of strengths. These hopeful individuals view the world as full of opportunities and optimism. Even when they face difficulties in their mission to serve others, they see them as brief setbacksrather than insurmountable challenges. We are fortunate to have such a person here on the Backstretch at PARX Racing.

Jaffet Herrera was born in Costa Rica and came to the United States with his family around the age of three. Before his father was able to secure a better job and obtain them an apartment of their own, his family shared an apartment with six other families. After completing his education at Bucks County Technical High School, Jafet went on to study at Bucks County Community College. This was not an easy undertaking, as he had to pay for his studies because of his immigration status, which disqualified him from financial aid. His efforts paid off, as he was able to earn an associate degree in multimedia and digital design. He began working at an insurance agency, and the first thing he learned was that "they were not in the business to help people but were in the business to make money." Jafet did not welcome this style of thinking. His father, a pastor, attended a luncheon and met Chaplain Bunker, who needed a part-time secretary—just the kind of career shift Jafet needed. He began as a secretary, answering phones and taking messages, but quickly became involved in calling donors and picking up food and produce for those on the backstretch. Jafet enjoys working with the people on the backstretch and happily stated, "We're in the business of helping people. We're not in the business of making money." Now, as the Assistant to the Chaplain, his days are often filled with clerical work such as organizing counseling for someone, assisting with Medicare applications, handing out food, reading mail to those who cannot read or write English, or consoling someone who has recently lost a family member and must attend a funeral.

During his free time, he is utilizing his love of drawing and design to work on his first children's book, which he intends to finish in the coming months. As for the future, he hopes the Chaplaincy continues to deliver current services while also expanding and opening new programs, such as weekly or bi-weekly educational classes for individuals on the backstretch.

Jafet explained, "Some people back here, all they know are the horses. These educational programs might provide them with other skills and let them know they are not alone in this." He doesn't discount the possibility that he would one day follow in his father's footsteps and become a pastor in the future: "My mindset has always been if I don't do it no one will. If we don't help these people out, who will?"

We wish Jafet tremendous success in both his professional and personal lives and hope he remains an ongoing presence at PARX for a long time.


