Best Bets: THE TIRE MAN (5th) – BOLT OF AURUM (7th)

- REMARKABLE MO Claimed from final two starts in Kentucky; switches to hot Padilla stable.
- 4 SPINNING HEART Rallied well sprinting first local attempt; often close in earlier routes.
- I CAN DO MAGIC Distant fourth in very tough field; dueled in prior try won by stretch-runner.
- HEAT ALERT Faded in "key" race from which four runners captured next starts; back in route.

Race 2

- RECKLESS PLACE Easily second best behind runaway winner in improved effort this level.
- RAHMER Led to stretch against similar but far behind previous outing at Penn National.
- SHANGHAI SUPERFLY Eight-year-old seen better days but \$306,973 earner always a chance.
- SPOTTED BULL Possibility if disregard last; often close earlier here and in Jersey.

Race 3

- BORRACHO CONCHO Hard used dueling rival which repeated last week; gets off Lasix.
- 3 HEAVY TIMBER Lightly raced and faced tougher in past; finished just ahead of top choice.
- CHECKING BOXES Retreated in bulky field after claim but speed to pose threat this yardage.
- WHY STOP THERE Used up after early roughing and showed determination in maiden score.

Race 4

- WIKI LIO Closed strongly last week when removing blinkers and extra furlong should help.
- FLAG SONG FLYIN Changed barns again and figures close on best; works out inside rally.
- MERRYCHILL Victim of bad stumble after layoff at Penn National; can't dismiss at this level.
- 4 HYACINTH BUCKET Wore down maidens despite 10 months absence when adding Lasix.

Race 5

- THE TIRE MAN Difficult trip first route attempt and strong effort here in August; merits edge.
 - NATIONAL LAW Midpack on Colonial turf after early trouble in Jersey bow; \$250,000 purchase.
- L GOLDEN BOY Rallied behind smashing winner as extreme longshot; might like two turns.
- RIVER'S GAMBLE Competed better than odds predicted again and outran top pick earlier.

Race 6

- JW'S THIRD MISCHIE Crushed slightly lesser in confidence booster and realistic next step.
- BAAFEED Overcame bad start when voided claim in September; ability advantage if ready.
- POWER AGENDA Hard to like or ignore plunge after trailing badly; remains quick as threat.
- PYLON Close again despite traffic trouble in stretch; shown ability to rate from off leaders.

BOLT OF AURUM – Pulled away with energy in reserve in second outing after hiatus; solid field. WINNING TIME – Edged clear despite severe early pressure; ran off in prior attempt after layoff. ALPINE THUNDER – Overmatched at Aqueduct but tigerish at Monmouth; outrun in local races. DON'T WAIT UP – Defeated quality field at Laurel after sharp local try; won 8 of 26 lifetime. Race 8 STRASSE – Chronic poor starter but faces softest group of career following claim from this spot. BIRTHDAY BOND ROB – Given necessary time off after voided claim again; dangerous if ready. MENDELSFLY – Humbled by runaway winner in route but that conqueror far back twice since.

KHOPESH – Capable in past but not much recent months; early excuse in last and sheds weight.
