Let me begin by wishing everyone a healthy, prosperous, and Happy New Year. May you all have many winners in 2025. Having said that the subfreezing winter weather has played havoc with PARX resulting in 8 1/2 racing cancelations and numerous days of lost training. We all feel the economic pain as no one is exempt.

We look forward to seeing everyone on Saturday, February 15th at Celebration's for our annual PTHA Awards Banquet celebrating the very best of PARX in 2024. Stop by the Administration building to purchase your tickets (\$35 each) today as we expect to sell out.

With regard to the brutally cold weather, I want everyone to know that Joe Wilson PARX COO has been very accomodating. He's onboard in making up the lost racing days whenever possible. We're also discussing the turf course as PARX is ready to spend nearly a million dollars in trying to get it right. There's no guarantee of success. Therefore, turf experts have been consulted to advise us if it's even possible? If not, there are two other options, both very, very expensive. One is to replace the turf course; or, we can remove it and install a Tapeta state-of-the-art "poly turf" course. Before any decision can be made we need to carefully study all the available data. Yours truly has been meeting with PARX Senior Management, our partner, to explore different ways to increase field size and parimutuel revenues that are mutually beneficial to the casino and you, the horsemen. ## The Heart of Racing: A Call to Action

Another track closing, another day where it feels like the bigger tracks are all that's left. Tomorrow looks bleak for those of us invested in this industry and the way of life it has given us. The headlines scream of cheaters, whip violations, and isolated tragedies, overshadowing the true heart of our sport—the bond we share with our horses and the dedication of the people who care for them. It's easy to feel attacked, especially when critics fail to see what we see: the open spaces, the jobs built around horses, and the raw beauty that makes this sport unique.

But instead of standing on the defensive, we must focus on the proactive measures we've taken and the passion driving real, meaningful change. Racing has been part of my life since I started at Atlantic City Racecourse in the 1980s. I've seen many highs and lows firsthand, from Genuine Risk winning for the girls to the controversy that followed her. Atlantic City had the best turf course in the country—now it's being torn down to make way for an Amazon facility. This is a stark reminder that racing's landscape is shrinking—tracks are sold off for better real estate prices, and our sport is losing ground, quite literally, to a changing world.

For racing to survive—and thrive—we must come together to elevate every aspect of what we do. It starts with treating our horses as the elite athletes they are, ensuring their care and welfare reflect their incredible contributions to our lives. At Parx, we know our horses are more than just running machines. They are family, and their well-being is our priority, from the foaling barn to the finish line, and into their second careers.

*Rehab. Retrain. Rehome. Relove.*

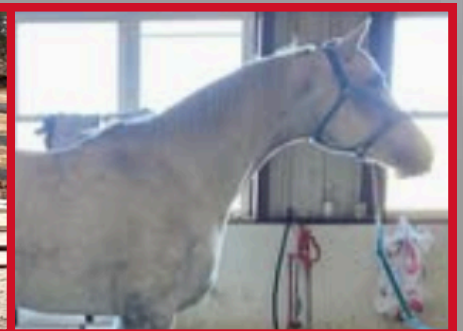

The stakes are high, and we can't afford to lose sight of what matters most.

We are committed to racing with love, responsibility, and conscience. We must continue to earn the public's trust, and actions like unscrupulous sales hurt everyone. This means going beyond mandates—whether it's the trainer who retires a horse at the right time, the owner who places a horse into an aftercare program, or the breeder who values soundness over speed.

These are the stories that define us—stories of dedication, resilience, and the unparalleled thrill of seeing a horse overcome the odds to be the best they can be. And yet, we know that too often, these stories remain untold. It's time to take off the blinkers, share the good, and be transparent in how we care for the horses who make our sport great. We have to honor the traditional rituals of horsemanship: learning from the ground up, investing time to understand and read horses, working with good trainers, and coming up in the business honestly.

The few bad apples must be removed. The survival of racing depends on all of us doing right by the horses. We must protect them, preserve our heritage, and adapt to a changing world with unity and strength. If we act wisely and together, Thoroughbred racing will endure—a legacy worth preserving for generations to come. All the best finishes reflect the horsemanship involved.

# Heartbeat of the Backstretch

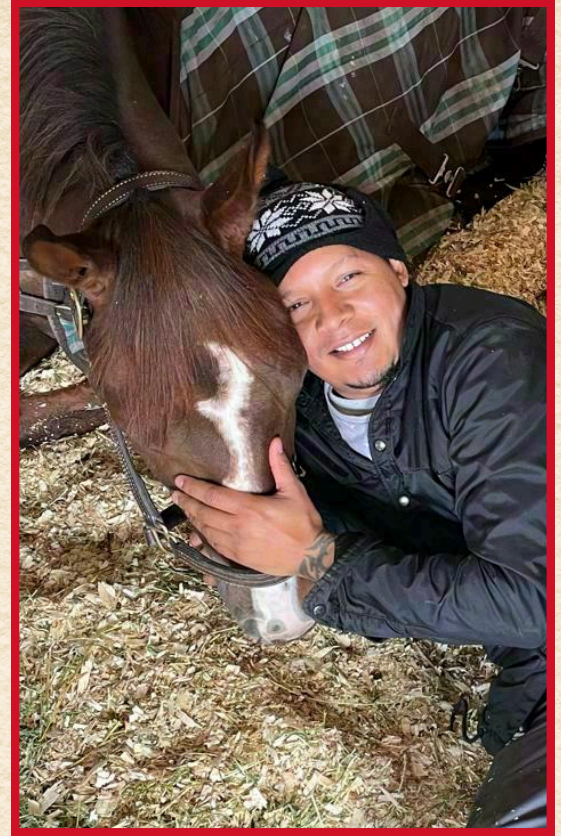

Melvin Amaro, a native of Puerto Rico, grew up around horses. He rode horses with friends and had fun while also caring for them. He began his career at PARX in 2005 as a hotwalker for Mike Farro before becoming a groom for Victor Collazo within a year. Being a groom is not an easy job, and trainers sometimes underestimate the amount of effort put in daily, especially because some grooms not only care for the horses but may even travel with them to other racetracks. Melvin takes pride in his work, "No matter what you have to be here. A good groom always takes care of the horses. People need to appreciate them more."

Melvin is presently part of Tim Smylie's team, grooming, clipping, and running horses for races. "Timmy is a nice person. He treats me good. Takes care of me and listens when I tell him a horse should walk and not train," Melvin remarked, emphasizing the need for partnership and continued, "It's teamwork. You do the right thing. Keep the horses safe. Keep them sound and do what the horse needs." He considers it part of his responsibility to observe things when in the stall with the horse every day. Communication between a trainer and the rest of the team is crucial. He enjoys being a groom and spending time with his current favorite bay horse, Commingling, which he affectionately calls "Chocolate."

Melvin shares it's difficult not to become attached to the horses, especially "When you see the horse coming around the turn, heading for home and it takes the lead and wins. You get emotional." Melvin is extremely proud of his three children and will always prioritize his family and grandchildren whom he loves dearly. He goes above and beyond to ensure their safety and happiness, even if it means doing DoorDash in the afternoons on occasion. He applies the same kind of effort to the horses he works with.
