Best Bets: LEFTVOER SUSHI (4th) -- RUMINT (7th)

### Race 1

- 5 LUCCHESI Closed well with bulky fields in final two Kentucky sprints; edge facing winners.
- HERO'S SPIRIT Used up dueling better company and decisive score earlier; speed along rail.
- VINI VIDI VICI Crushed maidens this yardage and threat again with renewed confidence.
- 4 ONLYGODCANJUDGEME Gained well this spot two months ago but ages since lone victory.

#### Race 2

- COACH KNIGHT Chased smashing winner in sprint when taking step forward with Lasix.
- WILD CAPTAIN Easily second best to favorite when showing ability around two turns.
- BIG SHOT VEGAS Traffic trouble on first turn in debut; better trip and experience can help.
- 5 FAST N SWEET Bothered early against similar in debut and upset chance with progress.

#### Race 3

- BAD ADVICE Drops after dueling winner long way in route; making third start since hiatus.
- 5 STOUTHEARTED Battled throughout this yardage and racing into shape after layoff.
- AVES MAKIN' WAVES Flashes of interest but finished behind top choice in 29th attempt.
- LORD SEABEE Narrowed gap wide in latest and improved last pair; soft opposition.

#### Race 4

- 5 LEFTOVER SUSHI Crushed two-time winners sprinting and showed route ability on turf.
- AMALFI LADY Prominent throughout latest but stuck this spot since July; often gets close.
- 4 BELLA MARIA Not much sprinting but could make progress stretching out with weight off.
- JOB'S NOT FINISHED Far behind in last after taking two prior outings; leading rider named.

#### Race 5

- SUNNY SIDE UP Recent claim finally gets stamina test and should manage to control fractions.
- JAYCE AND LIAM Easily second best to longshot winner this spot; good form at Finger Lakes.
- SISTER EVE Soundly outrun by second pick but sheds 10 pounds switching to "triple bug."
- LADY ROBO Faded under pressure as huge favorite after claim; likely to press pace.

#### Race 6

- 4 NUEDORF Victim of awkward break as favorite this spot and likely proves difficult to catch.
- ALMOND CIDER Speedy gelding shown determination lately and often forms bottom of exacta.
- TRUTH AND NOBILITY Not much since shipping from Florida but showed some speed in route
- MIZZEN MAN Fits well if throw out latest and numerous races closer than odds predicted.

## Race 7 RUMINT – Led throughout at Laurel and local conqueror stepped up and scored again. EXPECT TO BE READY – Plunges after retreating in mud last week; always threat this level. 8 CATTI LA BELLE - Never involved for higher tag after winning "key" race for this amount. SIRENETTA – Would prefer dry surface after failing as always on muddy footing; upset chance. Race 8 GRUENE HALL – Rallied behind heavily-backed newcomer in bow; progress anticipated. SHE'S JUSTIFIED – Troubled trip in bulky field and showed excellent speed over wet surface. GINGERSAYSCHILL – Closed gap in October debut at Penn National; adds Lasix and blinkers. CAROUSEL QUEEN – Faded behind top choice in seventh try; good before and tries blinkers. Race 9 ENFORCER – Hard-earned score when claimed and should fire again with logical next step. AZTEC – Blocked on turn then closed well when clear this spot; major threat with Carmouche. B B BAD – Stretch-runner with ample ability but on rare losing streak; needs aid of pace set-up REAL TALK - Weakened late behind decisive Ness barn winner in November; speedy and game. Race 10 WE READY – Exploded late in narrow defeat and extra sixteenth mile could prove helpful. MUSICAL HEART – Solid effort with tougher in route and adjusted well too sprint in past.

GEEBERT – Nine-year-old seen better days but stretch-runner can't dismiss with this kind.

GOLDEN WILDCAT – Used up early from extreme outside post and outran top pick previously
