Best Bets: BANJO (7th) – TALIESIN (8th)

- **5** AULA Hard used dueling in longer test captured by heavily-favored stretch-runner; hot barn.
- PIT BOSS Tired after Arce stable re-claimed in race taken by smashing winner; can be rated.
- MR. HUSTLE Finished ahead of second pick when dropped to this level; switches to "bug."
- 2 LEVEL UP Last couple discouraging but takes significant drop and formidable in past.

Race 2

- 4 MISS RAUCUS Remote fourth in much tougher field and should handle soft opposition.
- HURRICANE JANE Far behind in last but returns to amount of claim; signs of life earlier.
- NORHO'S GAMBLE Possible pacesetter with alert break but stamina woes persist in 22d try.
- BAHAMIAN BABY Closer than odds predicted last month; sheds 10 pounds in 26th outing.

Race 3

- REDOUBTABLERIPKEN Hinted at ability in debut but shelved since August; might wire inside.
- OLD MARSH Tried various surfaces at Gulfstream and threat this level returning to main track.
- 4 GRAND COMMANDER New Yorker drops into claimer and removes blinkers; major threat.
- SAMS AFTER PARTY Prominent throughout in weaker field at Penn; makes presence felt.

Race 4

- 5 SKINNY JOEY Excellent speed when leading throughout and claimed; could shake loose again
- MCKIRGAN Stretching out again with realistic drop and should be gaining late this level.
- SHEER DOMINANCE Very slow fuse but closed huge gap behind quick early fractions.
- WILD CAPTAIN Plunges after poor showing but fired in four previous attempts local routes.

Race 5

- GUAPONESS Appears in peak form and capable in front or from off pace; seeks fourth straight
- **GET SET Frequently close but failed at short odds last pair; often forms bottom of exacta.**
- **2** JESTER'S SONG Victim of early trouble after layoff at Laurel; strong local outing last summer.
- FINAL SHOT Ten-year-old lightly raced but ample heart and ability; nearing half million bank.

Race 6

- 2 AVA K'S BOY Sharp again in tougher version this spot and re-claimed by Diaz; short odds.
- PYLON Fading early again but offers speed inside and boasts 8 local victories over years.
- 3 JEBOLOGIST Heavily-backed and survived pressure in softer field to end long loss streak.
- **5** BARGAINING POWER Contributes to contested pace but usually comes up empty in stretch.

Race 7 BANJO – Used up setting rapid fractions this spot in longer test; nearly always fires for Catalano LUCCHESI – Wore down leader to end long losing skid and seems well-spotted for Solis stable. MUNYHUNGRY – Prompted pace long way in route and overmatched prior try in local bow. MALIBLUE - Plenty of early zip and hampered by poor starts last two local races; faces pressure Race 8 TALIESIN – Battled huge favorite in latest after overmatched Aqueduct; impressive win January. SHUBAGAIL – Used up dueling with solid Pa.-breds after crushing lesser in bow; main danger. STRESS RELIEVER – Raced sparingly but aggressive drop for Ness barn after \$40,000 claim. E T'S GYPSY ROSE – Caught tiring pacesetter in maiden score but likely tested with these. Race 9 HOUGHTON SHUFFLE – Ultra-consistent shipper nearly beat rugged rival; back after 12 days. REPO ROCKS – Million earner on rare losing streak but back sprinting and often excels locally. WINDSOR GOLD – Another determined score with closing kick; strong record with Haddock up. ONE MORE SCOOP – Sharp effort in first start of season; upset possibility with some progress. Race 10 CHELSEA WALL – Failed on road trips and overmatched last local try; fits against this kind. RUMINT – Changed barns again and stretches out with speed and proven route ability. TITOSCHANGEDMYLUCK – Roughed early then dueled eventual winner after Solis barn claim.

Race 13 PIMLICO - THE \$2,000,000 PREAKNESS STAKES

JOURNALISM – Powerful runner-up effort in Ky. Derby after winning three straight graded stakes

CLEVER AGAIN – Romped twice at tough Oaklawn meet after long absence; likely tries to wire.

RIVER THAMES – Solid try in Blue Grass after edged by Ky. Derby winner Sovereignty at Gulf.

GOAL ORIENTED – Baffert runner perfect in two starts and takes major jump; \$425,000 purchase

GUN RUNNIN' GAL – Decent effort this spot but eligible for softer company; best needed.
