Best Bets: VALENZAN DAY (8th) – DUKE OF GLOUCESTER (9th)

### Race 1

- L GOLDEN BOY Making steady progress and third outing since hiatus; very competitive field.
- 4 MARVELOUS MO Speedy gelding just missed in sprint and tries route first time as threat.
- TRULLI WARRIOR Rallied well with similar and continues to improve after long absence.
- 8 VIX Sharp as longshot earlier in month at Ellis Park; moves to Solis barn for stamina test.

### Race 2

- 4 COCOA'S VIXEN Chased streaking winner in another good effort; should handle extra furlong.
- **2** BURNER ACCOUNT Set pace before humbled by runaway winner in return; won March stake.
- HOW SWEET SHE IS Fired both local attempts and finished ahead of second pick this spot.
- DELICATE Clear early then weakened in mud this yardage; pair of impressive scores before.

#### Race 3

- TO BE LOVED BY YOU Dueled long way with tougher in routes; competing cheapest ever.
- 3 JODY'S RUBY Plunges back on main track in third race since hiatus; more yardage obstacle.
- **5** ALYVIA'S GIRL Might hold ability advantage but idle over four months and major drop.
- TWIST HER Far behind lately but recent \$16,000 claim entered with \$7,500 tag; top stable.

#### Race 4

- 2 MALIBU STAR Gained late behind repeat winner despite stumbling start; closer to pace here.
- LOVE ME NOT Claimed by Ness for \$20,000 and idle couple months; most success on grass.
- **4** EXPENSIVE CUT Edged in Oaklawn finale and switches to Mosco barn; on rare losing skid.
- 3 CAPITAL CONQUEST Soundly beaten at Colonial and winless long time but likely gaining late.

#### Race 5

- MR. BOGAN Used up dueling classier in route and well-spotted; back in sprint with Sanchez up
- JADON'S HONOR Retreated with quicker group on muddy surface but prior race very strong.
- WYATT HUNTER Trailed badly when overmatched; showed speed and determination in bow.
- EL MEDIAONOCHE Captured four of last five outings in game style and figures close again.

#### Race 6

- PACHELBEL Game and versatile mare keeps firing and exits big effort in classy field last week
- 5 JUMP A FOX Much-improved stretch-runner lacked best kick behind top pick but upset chance
- AMBITIOUSLY PLACED Terrific 15-for-35 over this course but last discouraging; best required.
- 2 SNAPPY RIDE Often closer than odds predict and developed nicely in hot Lupe Guerrero barn.

## Race 7 8 VEKOMA'S WAR – Flashes of ability in Florida and from hot barn; Preciado shippers excelling. MARILYN M – Battled heavily-backed newcomer to final furlong in return when adding blinkers. MISCHIEVOUS TWINS - Well-bred filly far back twice as juvenile but flying in works for return. SILENT WRATH – Sire won only four of 33 attempts but \$70,000 purchase flying in mornings. Race 8 VALENZAN DAY – Ran into tiger when easily second best returning for local bow; 10-for-25 mark MARTY'S MAGIC – Dueled to final yards in solid effort and scored this level before; figures close DREAMING OF GERRY – Drifted very wide on turn then re-bid behind top selection. GREENER PASTURES – Formidable during winter but not at his best lately; can't dismiss yet. Race 9 DUKE OF GLOUCESTER – Pulled away with energy in reserve and Moore re-claimed for \$40k. SMOOTH FLYIN MIKE – Failed to give true measure in Monmouth sprint but strong local form. DROPLINE - Rapid gelding been idle with series of decisive scores and already handled route. PIRATE – Lightly raced and failed to fire as 8-5 chalk at Colonial; ended loss streak Aqueduct. Race 10 GOLDEN ICE – Fired all three outings for hot Dunn barn and should offer finishing kick. SMILE MON – Speedy gelding exits big effort at Aqueduct after Ness bought for \$50,000. PRINCE COLTON – Dueled to final furlong in another solid effort for Lake; might shake loose. REAL MEN VIOLIN – Sharp in Churchill finale but just one-for-17 lifetime; competed in stakes.

	STANDPOINT – May have needed turf outing after layoff and puts blinkers back on and drops.
6	WARHEADED – Chased smashing winner in last and races cheapest yet; fits with this kind.
1	KERNER – Good speed in routes but absent since April; removes blinkers with inside zip.
2	SON OF DELILAH – Trailed in debut then sidelined 11 months; gets Lasix and dangerous if fit
