Best Bets: CHINESEIAM (3rd) – RACEY RUBY (8th)

- 4 JUSTHEART Switches turf to dirt and won "key" race locally in prior try for leading Ness barn.
- TWIST HER Overcame traffic woes in narrow score when claimed; soundly beaten by top pick.
- UNION BELLE Failed to fire at Monmouth following good local outing after hiatus this spot.
- ROYAL UPSTART Pair of losses as heavy favorite on wet surfaces; often close for Solis stable.

### Race 2

- PROJECT MAXIMUS By top sire City of Light which won four Grade I stakes and 5 million.
- **5** EXTRASEXYZQTEEPEYE Encouraging debut and stakes-winning dam won 7 of 15 races.
- TIZA SMOKESHOW Newcomer by Volatile which won 5 of 6 starts including Grade I sprint.
- DREAM LIKE COCO Rookie from John Servis barn out of dam which won 11 races, \$400,000.

#### Race 3

- 5 CHINESEIAM Used up dueling tougher company and romped prior try; back at level of claim.
- UNSWAYED Finished ahead of top pick and early pressure again, big effort on occasion.
- 2 CISCO KID Switches turf route to dirt sprint moving to Linder barn; likely stalking trip.
- NIMMO Forced pace long way in route and prior two losses on road trips; likely gaining late.

## Race 4

- 2 MAGIC EIGHT BALL Significant drop returning to main track and difficult to catch this level.
- 4 MISS CINNAMON Benefited from contested pace in sprint but less success around two turns.
- FAR HEART Offers speed inside and decisive score in June route; third race since layoff.
- **5** ALMA BRILHA Not much lately on wet footing but might regain closing rally on fast surface.

#### Race 5

- 2 SCUDETTO Adjusted well to sprint in Jersey score; heavy favorite that test suffered rough trip.
- PROBATIONER Boasts four victories and remains eligible as 3-year-old; voided claim in July.
- SOUTHERN DREAM Remote fourth as 6-5 chalk this level; lone victory from 24 attempts.
- SUPREME MIND Speedy gelding back on main track but often hampered by stamina issues.

## Race 6

- UNION DOOS Heavily-backed in sharp debut and should benefit from experience for Reid barn.
- 4 IN THE BIZ By talented sire Divining Rod which captured Preakness stakes; few clues in works
- SHE'SCOMIN'UPROSIE Soundly outrun by top pick and stablemate in bow; progress needed.
- SAVOR IT Sire Vino Rosso, son of Curlin, won Breeders' Cup Classic and \$4.8 million.

# Race 7 8 MAILATA – Prepared earlier at Saratoga and stallion Maximus Mischief sires many quick runners TOUGH GUY TONY – Stablemate of top pick rallied after slow start in Jersey debut; can progress VINO GRAY – Another son of Vino Rosso reveals little in many works; \$40,000 buy this year. JOY BOY – Rapid sire stands with \$30,000 fee but this colt sold for \$5,000 as juvenile. Race 8 RACEY RUBY – Excellent effort on turf after layoff and impressed locally in past on main track. HOW SWEET SHE IS – Chased series of capable rivals at various distances; case of seconditis. PUT THE CRAZY AWAY – Faded behind second choice and rare route attempt; upset chance. ZONING ORDER – Hard-earned upset in slightly softer company to end losing streak. Race 9 WAX BOX - Removes blinkers and prior loss in sloppy route; impressive score here in debut. OTTER MISCHIEF – Sharp at Delaware after determined local victory; serious threat again. MARVELOUS MO - Speedy and game gelding edged favorite and pushed second pick to limit. LET'SMAKEITADOUBLE - Back sprinting with blinkers added and much best in December bow Race 10 HOLY LADY – Shelved since poor start in debut defeat in January; gets Lasix and drops. SAINT GRACE – Battled favorite this spot first local outing; obvious danger with similar effort.

YOUNG AND PRETTY – Shipper from high percentage Barboza stable competing cheapest yet.

AWESOME SUNSHINE – Set clear pace in Monmouth route after breaking through prior to start.
