PARX is now on our annual summer break until we reopen on Monday,
August 18th for Owners Appreciation Day with HUGE purses. It's our one day when we say thank
you to all owners who support PARX all year round.

On Friday, August 1st a contingent of us will be heading up to Saratoga to see a wrong - finally righted as after twenty-one years, our legendary, Smarty Jones, in his first attempt on the ballot will be inducted into Racing's Hall Of Fame and deservingly so. Sixteen modern day horses/people were nominated for this year. None of them made it; whereas, it's only fitting that Smarty Jones was the ONLY ONE elected. I can't wait until our First Lady, Pat Chapman, gives her acceptance speech for this long overdue honor. I made a promise a year ago to Mrs. Chapman and her trainer, John Servis. I then assembled a team of unsung heroes that know who they are. Thank you all for making this day possible as Smarty Jones is one of the greatest horses to ever peer thru a bridle. You gave of your time for the city of Philadelphia, PARX, and racing fans all across America as we are forever in your debt! It's going to be a great Smarty party. Somewhere, I believe Chappy will be smiling down from his balcony seat in heaven.

On another note there will not be any turf racing at Parx this season. That's the bad news. The good news is we have assembled a team of professionals and are confident that come early next spring PARX will have one of the finest turf courses in the Northeast as we hope to open early. I'd like to commend PARX COO Joe Wilson who has worked hand and hand with your PTHA Board to get this done. Thank you Joe.

Next up, thanks to Board Member John Julia's business acumen, we were able to negotiate a great deal with Comcast who will be spending nearly a half million dollars to build much needed WiFi on the backstretch including for our barns, dormitories, and recreation hall. The work is starting now as we hope to have it completed before the end of the year. Another great big shout out to PARX COO Joe Wilson for his authorization.

If you haven't heard HISA has UNACCREDITED our Pennsylvania lab for drug testing for the next six months. HISA has instructed that all drug testing now be conducted in Colorado. The PTHA had been paying out of the Racehorse Development Trust Fund (RHDTF) \$3.5 million annually for drug testing as was legislated by our politicians in Harrisburg. The Pennsylvania lab is no longer providing us any service. Your Board, as a first step, negotiated with the Pennsylvania Racing Commission who will reassign those funds to pay the Colorado lab so we will not be double dipped. Stay tuned as further negotiations are ongoing in which we will keep you apprised. We shouldn't be paying for services that we are no longer receiving. That money could be utilized for higher purses which will result in higher parimutuel revenues both for our horsemen and the casino as it will increase field size as well as the quality of horses racing.

In case you're worried about your purse earnings, I will mention again that you should come into the PTHA office to sign a WAIVER that you will return the money should your horse come up with a "very rare" positive. If you do, you can receive your purse earnings as early as the following Thursday of the next week before the drug testing results are known. This is just another example of my administration working hard for you our wonderful PTHA constituents. Before this WAIVER we were waiting three weeks or longer for our money. We know cash flow receivables in any business is always a problem. Your Board enacted this measure to help you meet your obligations!

Last but not least, I'm pleased to report that our Petition against the Board has been settled amicably. Your entire Board is now working together harmoniously for you. We look forward to a large turnout when racing resumes again on August 18th. Here's hoping we have a spectacular second half in 2025. My door is always open if you need to speak with me. Enjoy the summer break.



On July 2, 2025, the Bucks County litigation among members of the Board of Directors of the PTHA was settled on terms that all parties believe to be in the best interest of the PTHA and its 2,500+ members. In connection with the settlement, the parties recognize that all Directors have acted in good faith and in the best interest of the Association at all times and that no party should be removed from the Board based on the conduct raised in the litigation. As a result of the settlement terms, the Board of Directors will seek to implement a plan of action that they collectively believe will benefit the PTHA and its members. Saying goodbye to a loved one is never easy. In recent years, we've lost many people in the racing industry, but it's important to remember that in this world, our loved ones aren't all human. Some have four legs, a fiery spirit, and hearts as big as the track they ran on. Verdick was one of those. Verdick wasn't just a racehorse. He was a partner, a personality, a constant in one trainer's life for over two decades. He raced 82 times in his career, finishing first 12 times, but his legacy reaches far beyond the winner's circle.

Steve Krebs claimed the chestnut gelding in November 1999. He'd lost a horse in a claim at Delaware and found himself drifting, spending claim money at the track, chasing luck at the Meadowlands. A good hit in the betting ring gave him one last shot. He picked up a racing form and found a Pennsylvania-bred gelding with consistency. That was Verdick. When Steve first got him, he was warned: "Watch him—he's dropped a few riders." But Verdick proved to be more loyal than wild. Over time, they found a rhythm. Verdick hit the board 20 times for Steve—eight of those were wins. But the real victory came not at the finish line, but in the bond they built.



In 2003, Steve made the decision that many trainers wrestle with. Verdick wasn't performing like he used to, and though there was no formal retirement program like Turning For Home back then, Steve couldn't bear the thought of not knowing where he'd end up. So, he brought him home. Steve said. "My mom wasn't sure at first. She saw him and said, "He's so big!" For many years, well into her 90s, Steve's mother fed Verdick twice a day, rain or shine. This past summer, Verdick didn't come to his feed. "He didn't want to eat one morning," Steve recalls. "That just wasn't like him. It was very hard. I had him a long time."



Verdick's passing is a personal loss—not just for Steve, but for everyone who knows the quiet truth of racing: that behind every saddle is a story of deep love. In a time when the sport is often portrayed in the harshest light, it's important to share the reality that those of us on the backstretch know well. The love for these horses runs deep. They are more than athletes. They are our companions, our pride, and often, our healing.

Steve still has others—Pair of Tricks, born the same day as Verdick but a year earlier, and her daughter, Ms. Hemmings. He admits he'd keep every horse he's ever trained if he could, "But I know I'd go broke feeding them all. That's why programs like Turning For Home matter so much—to give these horses the safe landings they deserve." Verdick may not have gone on to a second career in the show ring or dressage arena. He found something even better—a home, a family, and 22 years of loyalty, peace, and love.

Rest well, Verdick. You were never just a number on a form or a name on a program. You were loved.
