Best Bets: LOST AND CONFUSED (8th) - METALHEAD (9th)

Race 1

- DEPOLI Solid effort despite poor start when easily second best; set to end long losing skid.
- BIAGIO Fair showing at loftier level after prevailing on road trip; draws rail and usually fires.
- 4 EMPIRE SKY Romped on Monmouth turf and appears to handle various surfaces as threat.
- 2 OKIE DEN DEN Back at preferred yardage with Lopez and already proven he fits with this kind.

Race 2

- 4 ENCRYPT Sharp after two month hiatus when returning from Kentucky; conqueror good again.
- BOTTLES Front-runner captured 5 of 11 attempts and claimed again; likely to shake loose.
- RIVER'S GAMBLE Failed to offer true measure on wet surface and back around two turns.
- 2 SKULL HONOR Claimed for \$16,000 at Monmouth and hit board all four local outings.

Race 3

- 4 SCUDETTO Eliminated at start in latest after upset winner at Monmouth; late bid anticipated.
- STARLORD Probable favorite plunges after costing \$16,000 earlier; dangerous this level.
- MYSTIC LUTE Good speed but weakened late when runner-up again; Pino barn at 37% here.
- PONTIAC Forced pace when humbled by smashing winner; must put it all together.

Race 4

- **5** EXPECT TO BE READY Game mare rebounded from poor showings to wire latest as longshot.
- 2 IRIE EMPRESS Chased capable group at Penn after crushing local rivals in mud; dangerous.
- GUN RUNNIN' GAL Absent over two months but drops notch and won this spot in May.
- TIZ RACE DAY Weakened late under pressure again and likely pacesetter again from rail.

Race 5

- JUST CHEESY Trounced maidens in 13th attempt; possible repeater with renewed confidence.
- JUST BE HONEST No match for runaway winner in Jersey and fired this level locally in July.
- COACH KNIGHT Hard-earned score in softer field and remains eligible as three-year-old.
- RENARD Trailed badly after layoff but takes significant drop and can't dismiss this level.

Race 6

- 4 SHEZA BERNARDINI Improved effort after claim by hot Miguel Rodriguez barn; sharp in Jersey
- POPOVER GAL Re-claimed soon as possible by Diaz stable when failing as odds-on chalk.
- MENDED WE STAND Finished just ahead of top pick and boasts seven victories from 39 tries.
- DENALI RAE Far behind in mud but Pino barn winning next out with third of claims.

Race 7 NUEDORF - Pair of decisive scores for Pino barn; worked quickly for step up in class. NINJA PRIZE – Last couple far from his best but formidable when right and Kirby stable 27%. LUCKY DUDE – Disliked wet surface as usual and claimed from six consecutive attempts. AMAZING WOO – Speedy gelding used up in taxing duel in "key" race; early pressure again. Race 8 LOST AND CONFUSED – Lacked room on final turn in tough field; impressed in prior outing. GOLDEN ICE – Bargain claim closed big gap to win again and taking realistic next step. MAD BANKER – Outrun at Delaware but romped last local start; back in with claim tag. MISSOURI RIVER – Upset capable group despite early trouble and won twice with Lopez up. Race 9 METALHEAD – Heavily-backed when outrun in quick event; much closer than odds predict prior. MY KID SYD – Promising effort after hiatus and moves to Danny Velazquez barn as threat. ORTHO STAR – Broke slowly in bulky field and performed well earlier at various meetings. ONE IMPROBABLE - Good speed elsewhere and first try for Pino barn; some progress needed. Race 10 LEX – Pressed eventual winner in strong effort and just missed two prior tries at Delaware. OTTER MISCHIEF – Battled throughout again as 4-5 chalk and obvious threat in strong field. COLONEL BOB – Back home sprinting on main track where he scored in June; figures close.

MR. BOGAN - Nearly always fires and sharp again after Ness took; rates off pace if necessary.
