Best Bets: CHACHACHING (2nd) – ASSEMBLY POINT (6th)

Race 1

- WAITWAITDONTTELLME Nearly caught heavy favorite in sprint after Soto-Martinez re-claimed.
- HI HEELED WARRIOR Hard to rate when facing "open" company; four 2025 wins with Castillo.
- K D KAKES Narrowed gap sprinting when taking plunge and rare attempt around two turns.
- FROSTED DIAMOND Fair try at Monmouth after sluggish break; might prefer shorter yardage.

Race 2

- 4 CHACHACHING Cruised past rivals after arriving from Kentucky; shorter time between starts.
- WICKED MELODY Remote third in possibly better field after romping at Monmouth; key threat.
- OKIE DEN DEN Frequently close but case of seconditis; stretching out with inside speed.
- BOYS OF SUMMER Distant third as favorite at Penn after crushing lesser locally in mud.

Race 3

- BAILOUT BILLY Rapid filly hampered by slow start in July; capable of shaking loose from rail.
- WEEKEND HONOR Rallied behind longshot winner when competing better than odds suggest.
- INSTANT VISION Throw out last and frequently close during 11 losses; best necessary.
- 4 SWEET DISTRACTION Good effort behind talented duo last week and makes 24th attempt.

Race 4

- 5 POPOVER GAL Stopped abruptly when claimed for twice this amount but ability advantage.
- GOLDIENESS Exits solid effort in Jersey after wiring local rivals; facing early pressure.
- 2 CREATIVE COPY Ran into tigress when re-claimed for this tag by Dandy barn; must respect.
- ROLLS ROYCE JOYCE Proven she fits against this kind and romped twice earlier for Arce.

Race 5

- TIGGY THUNDER Anticipated better when claimed but debut encouraging and could upset.
- SHE'S JUSTIFIED Speedy filly used up dueling on road trip but may prove difficult to catch.
- CRUISE MISSILE Humbled by runaway winner in mud after arriving from Kentucky; 15th try.
- ALYVIA MAVIS Third start for Ness stable and hit board in 11 of 21 races; threat on best.

Race 6

- 2 ASSEMBLY POINT Overcame bad start in terrific effort when claimed; can handle raise.
- 4 HEY PORTER Determined stretch-runner disqualified from victory when claimed by Plno.
- WALDRIP Plunges for leading barn but yet to regain last year's form; can't dismiss this level.
- CLASSIC UNION Fair showing at Penn but outrun locally this season; back with routers.

Race 7 BUCKS SOME – Ten-year-old mare seeks third straight nearing half million in earnings. FIVE STAR FRAN – Decisive score against three-time winners and just missed prior outing. SONADORA GIRL - Wide middle move before tiring late for higher tag; won twice with Lopez. COULD BE A COUGAR – Poor showing in mud but faced classier company in past as threat. Race 8 **GUAPONESS** – Nearly overcame eventful trip this spot after Carlos Guerrero claim; usually fires. FINAL SHOT – Veteran weakened in final furlong behind top choice; on rare losing streak. 5 UNCAPTURED STAR – Rapid gelding with sufficient ability but likely needs to shake loose. 3 HARP'S HOT CORNER – Back sprinting on main track and formidable here earlier in season. Race 9 SILENT MODE – Improving gelding prominent throughout as longshot; might continue progress. PRINCE COLTON – Probable pacesetter led to final stages when just ahead of top selection. 8 TRAFFIC MASTER - Significant drop after difficult wide trip; edged second pick in April.

ELOQUIST – Ness runner on rare losing streak but takes major drop; dangerous this level.
