

AROUND THE OVAL by Dani Gibson

November 15th

\$200,000 Claiming Crown Jewel - the marquee race from the prestigious Claiming Crown races ran at Churchill Downs was won by Double Your Money & jockey Melvis Gonazalez going 1 mile & 1/8th in a 12 horse field for owner/trainer Ben Dunn and owner Chris Mancusi.

November 22nd

Takethemoneyhoney & jockey Eliseo Ruiz finished a game second in the \$100,000 Willa on the Move Stakes at Laurel Park for trainer Michael Moore, owner/breeders Kasey K Racing Stable, Michael Day, and Final Turn Racing Stable going 6 1/2 furlongs.

Parx Racing delivered a thrilling afternoon of stakes action on Wednesday, November 26, as fans and horsemen enjoyed a holiday-week card packed with competitive fields, sharp performances, and plenty of Philadelphia racing pride.

Pennsylvania Nursery Stakes — PA Bred 2-year-olds, 7 furlongs, \$100,000

• Winner: Mailata, ridden by Mychel Sanchez. Mailata broke sharply from post 6 and seized the lead early over a sloppy, sealed dirt track, setting fractions of :22.58 and :45.32. He maintained his advantage turning for home and drew off strongly to win by 3½ lengths for trainer Butch Reid, Jr., owners/breeders Cash is King LLC & LC Racing LLC

Shamrock Rose Stakes — PA Bred 2-year-old fillies, 6 furlongs, \$100,000

• Winner: Divine Intentions. The Tyler Servis-trained filly led throughout under Frankie Pennington and won by three lengths, turning in an impressive, gate-to-wire performance for owner Carguys Racing LLC.

Cornucopia Stakes — 3-year-old & up fillies & mares, 6½ furlongs, \$75,000

• Winner: Alani. Trained by Michael Moore, the Competitive Edge filly outlasted a strong bid from Mega Mil to win by two lengths under jockey Andy Hernandez for owners Hardesty Stables & Michael Day.

Let's Give Thanks Stakes- 3 year olds & up, 6 ½ furlongs, \$75,000

A duel to the wire with PA Bred Maximus Meridius & jockey Mychel Sanchez getting the win over Howgreatisnate for trainer Butch Reid, Jr., owners LC Racing LLC, Cash is King LLC & Wellesley Stable.

Breakfast on the Apron: A Morning of Horses, Coffee & Community at Parx Racing






Renowned sportswriter and commentator Dick Jerardi proudly joined the Philadelphia Sports Hall of Fame on November 6, 2025, as a cherished part of its 22nd class. This special honor highlights Jerardi's impressive four-decade journey and his profound influence on Philadelphia sports, especially through his expert coverage of horse racing and college basketball. Throughout the years, Jerardi became a beloved figure at the Philadelphia Daily News, covering every Triple Crown race since 1987 and every NCAA Tournament since 1988, earning a well-deserved reputation as a respected and versatile voice across the nation. Outside of his writing, Jerardi is actively involved in the local horse racing scene. He co-hosts the weekly TV show Let's Go Racing, produced by the Pennsylvania Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (PTHA), and provides insightful analysis during the live broadcasts of the prestigious Pennsylvania Derby. His remarkable career has garnered many accolades, including five Red Smith Awards for his Kentucky Derby coverage, three Joe Hirsch Awards for Breeders' Cup features, and

the esteemed 2006 Eclipse Award for his influential series on the legendary horse Barbaro. Jerardi is truly admired for the integrity and excellence he consistently brought to celebrating the region's rich sports history. Congratulations to DJ on this well-deserved honor!

RACEHORSE RETIREMENT PROGRAM

Dear Horsemen,

As we close out another year at Parx, I'm proud of what **Turning For Home** has become—and how many people are part of that story. Since 2008, PTHA's Turning For Home has assisted more than **4,692** Thoroughbreds retiring from Parx Racing. As of Thanksgiving this year, **328** horses have already come into the program directly through Parx, putting us on pace for another record intake year. That is not a program winding down. It's a program owners actively trust and rely on.

One reason is simple: we move quickly and we do what we say. On average, a horse is out of the backstretch and onto a partner farm within about **seven days**. That protects the horse and protects owners from paying extra day rates while wondering what comes next. Behind every fast placement is a phone answered, a stall made ready, and a farm willing to say "yes" to a fresh retiree or a tougher case.

From the beginning, this didn't happen by accident. Early on, owners like Don Brooks of Stony Brook Stables pushed for better end-of-career decisions, sending x-rays to Dr. Patty Hogan and asking honestly, "Should this horse still be running?" At the same time, Michael Ballezzi, Esq. helped turn that philosophy into a lasting structure. By insisting on a real funding mechanism—per-start owner contributions, jockey support, and a formal commitment from the PTHA and Parx—we built a model that could stand where other efforts had failed.

Seventeen years later, that structure still holds, and it has allowed us to say, without exception, that no eligible Parx horse has ever been turned away.

Our barn records tell you who these horses are. PA stallion **Uptowncharlybrown** leads our list with **52** of his progeny coming through Turning For Home, followed by Jump Start with 44, and Uncle Lino already represented with 12 horses retiring from Parx through our program. These are proven PA-Bred racehorses with plenty to offer in second and even third careers. We also see the strength of the Pennsylvania program reflected in our numbers: approximately **1,400 PA-breds** have come through Turning For Home, compared with about **1,300 Kentucky-breds**. The same horses filling the entry box are the horses we stand behind when their racing days are done.

None of this would work without our Partner farms, and a few deserve special mention as the true "workhorses" of Turning For Home: Universal, Daisy Mae, and MNM with nearly 50 horses per year. These farms quietly take the good and the bad—steady, easy horses and the tougher rehab or behavior cases—and they are always there when we need extra care or an extra stall. Along with our other approved Partner Farms, they are the hands that catch our horses, manage surgeries and rehab, leg them back up, and help us place them safely into new homes. Without our farms, we are nothing.


This winter, we're also launching a very practical effort: a **Turning For Home Blanket Drive**. We've secured a wholesale price of \$50 per turnout blanket and will distribute new blankets alphabetically across our partner farms, stretching the funding as far as we can. Northern farms will receive heavyweight turnouts for the harshest weather; farms in milder climates will receive medium-weight turnouts. Every \$50 gift puts a new blanket on a Turning For Home horse's back this winter, keeping a horse warm and dry while they transition to turn-out and wait for their next chapter.

As we mark our **Day of Giving on Tuesday, December 2,** we'll be celebrating all of this—the founders and early supporters who had the vision to do it right the first time, the Owners and Trainers who keep choosing us, the Partner farms who make room for one more, and the adopters and donors who complete the circle. If Turning For Home has touched your life—through a horse you owned, trained, rode, adopted, or simply followed online—**thank you**. Together, we have proven that when aftercare is built correctly into the racing model, it works. On behalf of PTHA's Turning For Home, Inc., thank you for standing with us, for believing in the worthiness of Thoroughbreds beyond the finish line, and for helping us keep the promise that Parx horses are truly backed for life.

Seventeen years of placements: steady fees, strong partners, and growing trust from Parx owners.

By the Numbers: A Program That's Growing, Not Shrinking

The numbers tell the story:

- 4,700+ total Thoroughbreds assisted since 2008
- 326 horses accepted directly through Parx as of Thanksgiving this year
- Average of 7 days from track to partner farm placement
- Zero eligible Parx horses turned away in 17 years zero added fees to owners

Above is a chart of our placements and stipends, showing that:

- Our placement stipends have remained fair and steady between farms (\$1,750 average per horse)
- And in many cases, average support per horse is still lower than it was when we began in 2008,
- Even though the costs of hay, feed, bedding, farrier work, and veterinary care have risen significantly.

You will also see in our data that Pennsylvania-breds are well represented in our program:

- Approximately 1,400 PA-breds have come through Turning For Home,
- Compared with about 1,300 Kentucky-breds,

showing that the investment in PA-bred racing is matched by an investment in responsible PA-bred aftercare.

If you walk down the PARX Racetrack backstretch on a crisp December morning, you might spot Devon Carey bundled up, caring for horses with the calm confidence of someone who has truly found her place.

A few years ago, Devon was working full-time in a child care center. One hectic day during a break in the parking lot, she realized it was time for a change. As she scrolled through job postings, she found an opening for a cashier in the PARX backstretch kitchen and decided to give it a try.

For three years, she showed up to her job before a coworker asked if she had ever worked with horses. Soon after, she was introduced to trainer Everton "Fred" Smith, who put her in a stall with a tough horse and told her to figure it out. Devon is convinced that he hoped she would not come back. But she did, and she has been there ever since. She is known as the "Boss Lady," walking horses, bathing them, feeding them, and helping with nearly everything that needs to be done.

During this time, Devon had already earned her undergraduate degree from Penn State and completed her Master's in Educational Leadership from Bloomsburg University. She worked at an HBCU and now serves as the Assistant Director of Student Involvement and Leadership at Drexel University, where she is also working toward her doctorate.

Her favorite horse was a ten-year-old mare named Juliet's Music. Devon could walk her without a shank and spent many quiet moments by her side. When Juliet was suddenly claimed in a race, Devon was heartbroken. She asked Fred to claim her back, something he had never done before. In a small holiday-style miracle, he agreed. Juliet returned to the barn and soon won a race for them. She eventually retired through Turning For Home and is now happily settled in a wonderful home.

This holiday season, Devon's journey reminds us that the best gifts are often unexpected. One simple job posting led her to the horses, the barn family, and the purpose she never knew she was seeking.
